The National Strategy for Combating and Preventing Illegal Migration 2016-2026

Introduction

Egypt has taken proactive steps for countering illegal migration and smuggling of migrants through establishment of the National Coordinating Committee affiliated to the cabinet of ministers in 2014 and restructured in 2017 with 30 members; comprising mainly of relevant ministries, national and international councils. The National Committee is responsible for national and international policy coordination, and has been positioned as the focal point for all policies, national guidelines, action plans and programs related to the issue of illegal migration and the protection of migrants within the framework of international obligations arising from bilateral or international conventions. The National Committee has been implementing a number of legislative activities, resulting in the draft of the law "On combating illegal migration and smuggling of migrants," as well as social and field studies to identify the economic and social causes of the migration of youth and unaccompanied children, and produced the first map to identify the most important governorates exporting illegal migration.

It was a rational decision that the National Committee would quickly develop an integrated national strategy, reflecting the vision of the Egyptian State for combating illegal migration, that agrees with and keeps up with the governmental development plan 2030, and relies on solid grounds which are the respect of the rule of law and the principles and standard of human rights, as well as the communal participation and the regional and international cooperation.

The national strategy (2016-2026) aimed to protect the groups at risk of exploitation by smugglers, who are young people, children, their families, women and illegal migrants coming to Egypt, and aims to prevent and punish brokers and traders of illegal immigration through strict measures and sanctions, and to build and strengthen the capabilities of governmental agencies involved in implementing the strategy, such as law enforcement agencies, educational, religious, media and national councils, as well as the civil society.

The Third National Action Plan (2021-2023) is the executive arm for achieving the desired objectives and includes details of activities, programs, targeted groups, the authorities responsible for the implementation, determining the expected time period for completion of the activity and evaluation indicators. The most important objectives of the action plan are the following:

- Raise the information capacity on illegal migration issues.
- Mobilizing resources to support efforts to combat illegal migration.
- Strengthening the capacity of target groups and providing alternative opportunities.
- Activating the legislative framework in support of anti-illegal migration activities.
- Raising awareness of the issue of illegal migration.
- Protecting those most at risk of illegal migration.
- Building and strengthening the capacity of national actors working against the issue of illegal migration.
- Strengthen regional cooperation.
- Investing international cooperation to serve the cause.

The national strategy and the action plans that emanate from it expresses the continued significant political will of the Egyptian state in confronting the threat of illegal migration in the absence of the exit of an illegal migration boat since September 2016, also reflecting the integrated vision of the development process associated with facing this threat in addition to protecting the vulnerable groups as a result of the economic burdens resulting from Covid-19... The combination of national, regional and international efforts is capable of achieving the desired success in protecting the lives of innocent citizens from the exploitation of death brokers.

Factors Affecting Illegal Migration

1- Political Factors

a. International Political Factors

- International attention to illegal migration, which supports national efforts to combat illegal migration.
- Escalation of wars and disputes in the region.
- Spread of terrorism phenomenon in the region.
- Instability of some political regimes in the region.
- European-Turkish agreement on the return of migrants.
- Restrictions imposed on legal migration to foreign countries.

b. Local Political Factors

- State interest and strong political will in facing illegal migration issue.
- The establishment of the National Coordinating Committee for Combating and Preventing Illegal Migration and Trafficking in Persons (NCCPIM&TIP).
- “Egypt Vision 2030”.
- No cases of illegal migration boats were recorded to have set off from Egyptian coasts since September 2016.
- “Misr Tantaleq (Egypt kicks off) 2018-2022”.

2- Economic Factors

a. International Economic Factors

- Economic growth recession witnessed across the world.
- Inflation and deflation of currencies in some countries as a result of the economic crises.
- Economic consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic.

b. Local Economic Factors

- Stability of economic conditions.
- Appreciation of Egyptian pound.
- Increase in intensive-labor national projects.

3- Social Factors

- Population growth.
- Change in demographic structure and an increased percentage of youth in the population pyramid.
- Students dropping out of schools in villages to help families with income security.
- Social perspective of technical and artisan education.
- Continuation of consumer culture, and people boasting of travelling abroad and the desire to imitate others.
- Lack of a clear function for role models.

4- Technological Factors

- Technological development (modern means of communication) contributing to raising the aspirations of youth.
- Diminishing the role of vocational education and its inability to enhance the skills of youth to meet the current technological developments and labor market needs.
- Capability of illegal migrants' agents to manage and promote their activities in an easier way depending on modern telecommunication.

5- Legal Factors

- Adopting Law Number 82 of 2016 and its Executive Regulation on Combating Illegal Migration and Smuggling of Migrants.
- Considering some European laws as motivation for unaccompanied children migration.
- Adopting "Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration" (GCM).
- Restrictions imposed on legal migration abroad in a way that reduces its opportunities.

6- Environmental Factors

- Limited agricultural space compared to population increase and its impact on the economic conditions of farmers and their families.
- Drought and desertification acts as push factors out of Africa.
