Some relating articles of the Constitution

Article 19

« The man and the woman enjoy, in equality, the rights and freedoms of civil, political, economic, social, cultural and environmental character, enounced in this Title and in the other provisions of the Constitution, as well as in the international conventions and pacts duly ratified by Morocco and this, with respect for the provisions of the Constitution, of the constants and of the laws of the Kingdom.

The State works for the realization of parity between men and women »

Article 31

« The State, the public establishments and the territorial collectivities work for the mobilization of all the means available to facilitate the equal access of the [female] citizens and [mal] citizens to conditions that permit their enjoyment of the right to healthcare; to social protection, to medical coverage and to the mutual or organized joint and several liability of the State; to a modern, accessible education of quality; to education concerning attachment to the Moroccan identity and to the immutable national constants; to professional instruction and to physical and artistic education; to decent housing; to work and to the support of the public powers in matters of searching for employment or of self-employment; to access to public functions according to the merits; to the access to water and to a healthy environment; to sustainable development. »

Article 34

« The public powers enact and implement the policies designed for persons and for categories of specific needs. To this effect, it sees notably: to respond to and provide for the vulnerability of certain categories of women and of mothers, of children, and of elderly persons; to rehabilitate and integrate into social and civil life the physically sensory-motor [sensorimoteurs] and mentally handicapped and to facilitate their enjoyment of the rights and freedoms recognized to all »

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Introduction

The Government Plan for Equality (ICRAM)¹ is a tool for the actual implementation of the commitments expressed in the Government Policy Program for the 2012-2016 period. It has been developed keeping in mind the challenge of ensuring the democratic implementation of the provisions contained in the new Constitution as well as Morocco's obligations with respect to achieving the Millennium Development Goals.

The Plan also provides a platform to pool the various initiatives taken in order to mainstream women's rights in public policies and development programs in full consistency with the requirements of the current juncture to give a local and regional dimension to these policies and programs.

In the very Preamble, the Moroccan Constitution stresses on prohibiting and combating all forms of discrimination on the grounds of sex, color, creed, culture, social or regional background, language, disability or any other personal consideration. This is considered an important gain which involves a collective responsibility to adopt a new approach towards measuring the impact of government and community action with respect to gender equality, its monitoring and assessment. Moreover, the fact that the Constitution grants primacy to international conventions, within the framework of constitutional provisions and the Kingdom's laws, sets the stage for a modern state with advanced specificities that are in line with the country's immutable values and principles.

This orientation constantly derives its strength from the instructions of His Majesty King Mohammed VI ever since His Majesty's accession to the throne in 1999, strongly stressing the close link between the progress and prosperity of the Moroccan society, on one hand, and respect for human rights - especially those of women –on the other.

- All stakeholders united to improve Moroccan women's conditions

The adoption by the Moroccan Government of the “National Strategy for equity and equality” in 2006 and the publishing by the Prime Minister in 2007 of a circular urging government authorities to adopt a gender approach in sectorial policies and programs, induced government agencies to prepare and implement various programs and initiatives on equality.

Building on previous achievements, and thanks to the political will expressed by the government in its program for the 2012-2016 period in light of the new Constitution, which lays emphasis on promoting democratic principles, ensuring equity and equality among citizens and providing for good governance, this Plan has been developed with the contribution of all governmental sectors; it is composed of the following eight axes:

1. Institutionalize and disseminate the principles of equity and equality, and pave the way for gender parity
2. Combat all forms of discrimination and violence against women
3. Upgrade the education and training system on the basis of equity and equality
4. Promote fair and equal access to health services
5. Upgrade basic infrastructures to improve the living conditions of women and girls
6. Social and economic empowerment of women
7. Equal and equitable access to administrative, political and economic decision-making positions
8. Achieve equal opportunity between men and women on the job market

24 objectives have been defined under the governmental plan, for which 156 chief procedural measures have been identified for their achievement. Gender-sensitive and quantitative indicators have also been defined for assessment purposes, in addition to naming the government department in charge of implementation for the 2012-2016 period.

The Government Plan for Equality is based on principles which are fully compatible with the desire to build new social relations between men and women, and it aims to ensure full, and equitable participation in all fields and it also aims to ensure that fair and equal benefit is derived from the results of this participation.

The equality targeted by the Government Plan is a humanitarian principle which is in line with the civilizational and family values of the Moroccan society. These values have been consolidated by the new Constitution, which has reinforced the relations based on rights and duties.

This equality is based on the following :

- Equality in terms of rights, responsibilities, resources and opportunities, as stipulated in the Moroccan Constitution;
- Recognize the value of the contributions made by women and men alike, both in the public and private spheres;
- Promote affirmative action which makes it possible to ensure fairness to women;
- Take into account the needs, constraints, interests and aspirations of women and men alike when laying down, implementing, monitoring and assessing public policies and development programs;
- Acknowledge the requisites of full citizenship for both sexes without discrimination;

The Government Plan for Equality is based on the following :

- The Islamic faith, which calls for justice equity and equality and rejects violence;
- The Constitution, which provides that women and men shall enjoy civil, political, economic, social, cultural and environmental rights and freedoms on an equal footing;
- The high instructions of His Majesty the King with respect to the promotion of women's conditions;
- Morocco's commitment to achieve the Millennium Development Goals by the year 2015;
- Morocco's commitment to implement the provisions of international conventions, particularly the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), as ratified by Morocco.

First Axis : Institutionalize and disseminate the principles of equity and equality, and pave the way for gender parity

Article 19 of the Constitution provides that women and men shall enjoy civil, political, economic, social, cultural and environmental rights and freedoms on an equal footing, linking this with the State's responsibility to enforce the principle of gender parity. This implies the challenge of upholding the provisions of the Constitution and implementing them according to a participatory approach based on institutionalized mechanisms for the monitoring and assessment of the public policies concerned.

The lessons learned from the past decade – and which indicate - and that gender disparities do exist in spite of the efforts made, - underscore the need for a system of governance that promotes policy coordination and consistency, and supports the actors through an integrated training, awareness and sensitization plan. Support material and tools should also be developed to implement a new upgrading system based on equity and equality, including the formulation of indicators and statistics that enhance knowledge about women's issues and conditions, and facilitate monitoring and assessment.

To be effective, these reforms must be accompanied by a genuine will to change attitudes and behaviors, as well as the prevailing stereotypes and representations concerning the social roles of women and men in order to foster the principles of equity and equality. To this end, all socialization channels - family, schools, the media, mosques, scientific councils and cultural institutions...etc - should be tapped to achieve the desired change.

Adopting proper procedural measures and ensuring successful coordination regarding the **Government Plan for Equality** require the following :

- Create a strategic inter-ministerial mechanism for guidance, coordination and monitoring;
- strengthen the human and technical capacities of government stakeholders, especially the mechanism in charge of the plan's implementation, monitoring and coordination ;
- Establish an assessment and monitoring mechanism through the institutionalization of a unified information system.

To ensure the institutionalization and dissemination of the principles of equity and equality, the Ministry of Solidarity, Women, Family and Social Development will, in coordination with the various government departments concerned, supervise the achievement of the following objectives:

1. Monitoring and assessment of the situation of equality
2. Incorporation of the gender approach in the planning and budgeting activities of the various sectors;
3. Incorporation of the gender approach in the national statistical system;
4. Dissemination of the principles of equity and equality and improvement of the image of women

Second Axis : Combat all forms of discrimination and violence against women

Morocco was among the first countries to show a keen interest in fighting all forms of discrimination against women - a domain which saw concerted efforts made by government departments, the Parliament, civil society organizations, international partners and the media.

Today, Morocco continues to be actively engaged in - and is unwaveringly committed to - promoting a State based on the rule of law, as is clearly evidenced by the institutional and legislative reforms the State is seeking to introduce with a view to achieving fairness and gender parity in terms of rights and duties. Indeed, the provisions of the new Constitution stipulate that it is the responsibility of the State to combat all forms of discrimination.

The Constitution's Preamble stipulates that all forms of discrimination « on the grounds of sex, color, creed, culture, social or regional background, language, disability or any other personal consideration » shall be prohibited and combated. Article 19 of the Constitution also stipulates that "Men and women shall enjoy, on an equal footing, (...) civic, political, economic, social, cultural and environmental rights and freedoms", adding that the "State shall seek to achieve parity between men and women", and that "To this end, an Authority for Parity and the fight against all forms of discrimination shall be established".

In recent years, and as part of implementing the National Strategy to Combat Violence against Women, the Government has taken a series of measures in the area of combating this violence. The measures taken have contributed to breaking the silence concerning this phenomenon; basic services have also been provided to victims in addition to some other measures.

This axis of the Government Plan for Equality towards the Achievement of Gender Parity finds its rationale in various provisions of the Constitution, especially Article 22 thereof, which provides for the physical and moral integrity of people; it stipulates that: « the physical and moral integrity of anyone shall not be undermined by any person whatsoever, private or public, under any circumstances ». It also provides that « No one shall inflict upon another, under any pretext whatsoever, any cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment which undermines

their dignity ». This underscores the need to provide the necessary legal protection, and to sensitize society to make it reject all forms and manifestations of violence against women.

This policy is in line with Morocco's desire to honor its international obligations in keeping with a number of agreements as well as the Millennium Development Goals.

Moreover, the measures listed under this axis aim to:

- strengthen the regulatory and legal instruments for the protection of women and the fight against discrimination;
- promote better awareness about this phenomenon and set up a tracking and monitoring system;
- support preventive policies by addressing the root causes of violence against women and enhancing community awareness of the perils involved in this phenomenon;
- improve assistance to women who are victims of violence by developing a range of services in this regard.

Third Axis : Upgrade the education and training system on the basis of equity and equality

Education and training is a key sector for the development of our country. It is therefore a top priority in the Government's social platform. For this reason, the Government's efforts are focused on such issues as governance, the quality of the educational system and the need to restore its educational function, in addition to caring about the conditions of educational staff as part of a contractual methodology that puts learners at the heart of the educational process.

In view of the above, the Ministry of National Education's action plan is based on the following:

- Implement the provisions of the new Constitution, particularly with regard to developing and applying social programs to ensure equitable access to basic services, especially education, while upholding the principles of solidarity and equal opportunity for individuals, groups, generations and regions;
- the elections held in our country, which produced a government that considers education a top priority in its policy platform;
- the Head of Government's guidance memorandum on the preparation of action plans for the Ministry of National Education;
- starting the last year in the "emergency program" and the need to shore up what has been achieved and review project implementation in accordance with the priorities defined in the Government's Program.

In keeping with this frame of reference, the Ministry of National Education, its administrative units, which consist of regional education and training academies and national education delegations, have sought to develop a program of action based on strategic themes that are in line with the Government's Program:

- First axis : Make the educational institution a key element in the overall interest taken in the educational system;
- Second axis: Governance of the education sector;
- Third axis: Upgrade the school's functions and role.

Given the new dynamic for the promotion of human rights, entrenching the principles of equality and fighting all forms of discrimination within the educational system represent one of the greatest challenges that must be kept in mind when implementing the above axes, particularly with respect to educational curricula and the programs of regional professional training and continuous training centers. In parallel, a communication strategy has to be adopted to change attitudes, make values deeply rooted, promote initiatives in the field of innovation, encourage excellence and spread a culture of equality between children to bring about a generation imbued with the principles of human rights and gender equality.

Fourth Axis : Promoting fair and equal access to health care services

Improving health services is a strategic choice, the aim being to provide health care to every male and female citizen. Thus, Article 31 of the Constitution stipulates that “The state, public institutions and local authorities shall seek to muster all the means available to facilitate equal access of citizens to (...) the exercise of their rights to healthcare, social protection, medical coverage, mutual insurance or solidarity schemes organized by the State”. This is further enhanced by the Government’s Program for 2012-2016, which seeks to bolster the right of male and female citizens to access treatment and health services, in addition to many other social rights.

Given these rights, and in order to implement the above provisions, three integrated approaches based on rights, consultation and the consistency of health functional models have been adopted; they will provide the frame of reference for the achievement of the principle of health care for all, which all societies yearn for.

In this regard, the health policy is based on a desire to bring health services closer to the citizens, including reception, guidance, management, good governance, basic health care and hospital services, tackling communicable and non-communicable diseases, caring for women and children victims of violence, generalizing the RAMEC medical scheme, developing a drug policy to determine prices, investing more in generic drugs, promoting public-private partnerships, training more health professionals to meet growing needs, and further developing the policy of close services to the citizens.

In the area of maternal and child health, the part of the plan on this target population seeks to develop and consolidate services in order to speed up the reduction of maternal mortality rate and bring it to 50 deaths per 100,000 live births, estimated at 112 death in 2010 at the national level, and to reduce the under-five mortality rate to 20 deaths per 1,000 live births, while the rate was 36.3 % in 2010, in accordance with the Millennium Development Goals.

Fifth Axis : Upgrade basic infrastructures to improve the living conditions of women and girls

The development of basic infrastructure has a direct impact on the country's social and economic development. It makes it possible to break the population's isolation and enables people to have access to various services. It also contributes to curbing poverty and helps improve the competitiveness and productivity of economic operators, domestically and abroad. Morocco has been actively involved in infrastructure development, thus providing the means needed to achieve its ambitions in the areas of social and economic development.

In this respect, the pace of implementing major projects related to new cities, highways, ports, airports, and supply of water and electricity was stepped up. Morocco has also been at the forefront of the countries which pledged to develop clean and renewable energies.

The provisions of the Constitution have further consolidated this policy; thus Article 31 of the constitution stipulates that the State, public institutions and local authorities shall seek to muster all the means available to facilitate equal access by male and female citizens to education, treatment, health care, decent housing, access to water and electricity and life in a healthy environment.

This policy has been given tangible substance through the Government's Program for the period 2012-2016, which calls for undertaking an analytical assessment of the impact of the first and second programs to end the isolation of rural populations, and to develop a third program which aims to expand the process of ending these populations' isolation, in addition to other programs which are designed to improve the conditions of the populations concerned, especially women, by accelerating the pace of electricity supply, the construction of roads, support home ownership, expand health and education services, equip health centers, and monitor the enrollment of rural girls, making sure these diverse programs closely relate to one another.

The commitment to achieve equal opportunity throughout the phases of infrastructure project implementation, to facilitate women's access to property and to provide gender-segregated statistics in the areas of housing, energy, the environment and programs to end the isolation of certain populations are important avenues whereby to improve the living conditions of women and girls.

Therefore, the measures listed under this axis aim to re-engineer infrastructure programs to incorporate the various needs of women and men, making it compulsory to carry out a systematic study of the potential socio-economic impact expected from the various projects, and compile gender-specific data to facilitate follow-up and assessment.

Sixth Axis : Economic and social empowerment of women, girls and families

Poverty is a scourge which implies chronic deprivation of basic resources, capabilities and security, as well as the inability to enjoy decent standards of living.

In 2008, the national poverty rate in Morocco stood at 8.8 percent (14.2 percent in rural areas, against 4.7 percent in urban settings).

Women and girls are the segments most vulnerable to poverty. They account for more than half the rural population. Their activities are primarily associated with demanding household chores, given that there is no fair and equal access to basic structures. Moreover, rural women and girls suffer from illiteracy: 58 percent of rural women are illiterate, and 16 percent of rural households are headed by a woman. The maternal mortality rate in rural areas is twice that in urban centers. Of every 4 active women in rural areas, 3 are engaged in unpaid household work, compared to only 4.6 percent in cities.

The Moroccan Constitution stresses the economic and social rights of male and female citizens. Article 34 of the Constitution provides that public authorities shall develop and implement policies for disabled people and seek to address the conditions of vulnerable women, mothers...

Under the fourth axis, the Government's Program stresses the need to empower women and reduce the extent of their vulnerability by addressing the root causes of vulnerability, such as illiteracy, poverty, discrimination and violence. It also provides for support to be given to associations that assist women in difficult situations and seek to empower them politically and economically, promote their participation in public life and motivate them to be present in decision-making positions.

Sustainable rural development is one of the key sectors in which no success is possible without an acknowledgement of the important role played by the rural woman and her effective contribution to production as a farmer, a craftswoman, a trader, a laborer or a user of natural resources. In a world suffering from widespread poverty, food insecurity, growing rural depopulation and environmental degradation, the rural

woman is often obliged to rely on her own personal means to provide for family subsistence. She thus contributes to the development of the world around her despite the limited opportunities she has in terms of access to land, credit, supplies, techniques, skill development and communication means.

In view of the above, the measures listed under this axis are designed to contribute to eliminating the feminization of poverty by ensuring women's participation in the formulation and implementation of economic development strategies to eliminate feminization of poverty, support project development, training and professional capacity building, and create networks to develop income-generating activities, building on women's skills and on the human and natural resources available in regions provinces and communes; these measures are to be incorporated in local and regional development plans.

Given the importance of promoting women entrepreneurship in Morocco, and its positive impact on the national economy and the creation of jobs, the programs under this axis also aim to develop partnerships with various actors in order to enable women business leaders to have access to the means they need, including premises, supervision and easier access to the market.

Seventh Axis : Promote fair and equal access to civil service and political decision-making positions

Morocco has made considerable efforts to achieve significant representation of women in civil service and political decision-making positions. A number of measures have been taken to this end, a fact which led to a review of the Communal Charter and of the electoral code. The code of ethics which the political parties pledged to honor in this regard paved the way for a quota system through the adoption of a national list and an additional list.

Several achievements have been made thanks to mobilization and awareness activities by the various actors concerned - the government, civil society organizations and political parties – in order to encourage the involvement of women in the management of political and public affairs.

Yet, despite the efforts made, the results achieved remained limited compared with women's presence and actual contribution in various fields. Women's representation in Parliament rose from 10 percent in 2007 to 17 percent in 2011, and from 0.56 percent in 2003 to 12 percent in 2009 in local elections.

Women's representation in senior decision-making positions in the civil service remains extremely limited; thus, the rate of women's representation in managerial positions in 2009 was 14.6 percent.

Today, however, Morocco has opened a new chapter with the institutionalization of equality and the desire to move towards gender parity by virtue of the new Constitution. Indeed, Article 19 of the Constitution stipulates that "Men and women shall enjoy, on an equal footing, the civic, political, economic, social, cultural and environmental rights and freedoms", adding that the State "shall seek to achieve parity" between men and women.

Bearing in mind the challenge of ensuring the implementation of the above constitutional provisions, and to in order to give substance to the commitments expressed in the Government's Program, especially with respect to upholding women's political rights and enabling them to be effectively involved in decision-making, the Parliament approved, in May 2012, Regulatory Law 02.12 on appointment in senior positions, pursuant to

the provisions of Articles 49 and 92 of the Constitution. This will enhance women's participation in this regard. The said legislation defines the principles and criteria for appointment in senior positions, including equal opportunity, merit, transparency, equality and the need to avoid all forms of discrimination in the selection of male and female candidates for senior positions, including discrimination based on political or union affiliation, or on grounds of language, religion, sex, disability, or any other consideration which is inconsistent with human rights principles and the provisions of the Constitution.

Accordingly, under the sixth axis of the Government Plan for Equality towards the Achievement of Gender Parity, the aim is to give concrete meaning to this constitutional commitment through measures that promote women's participation and political empowerment. This is a challenge for society; it requires further mobilization and the combined efforts of all actors to achieve the desired goals.

Eighth Axis : Achievement of equal opportunity for men and women on the job market

There is a gap in terms of the participation of men and women in economic activity in Morocco. Activity rates differ according to sex and place of residence. In 2011, it stood at 3.25 percent for women, and 2.74 percent for men. The proportion of women who earn less than the minimum wage is higher than that of men, standing at 41 percent for women, against 31 percent for men.

As for the public sector, where equal pay is guaranteed for men and women who have the same qualifications, it should be pointed out that Morocco ratified international Conventions 100 and 111 on Equal Remuneration and on fighting Discrimination in Employment and Occupation, respectively.

There has been no significant evolution in the gender gap on the job market over the past ten years. This can be explained by considerations relating to the country's economic situation in terms of job opportunities. Indeed, employers are less likely to hire unskilled workers, most of whom are women.

The unfavorable working conditions, inflexible working hours, household responsibilities - which are mostly borne by women - and the difficulty to reconcile family obligations and work requirements, as well as the social and cultural environment which adversely affects employment opportunities for women, are all factors which contribute to widening the employment gap between men and women.

The implementation of the Constitution's provisions, including the ones providing for combating all forms of discrimination as well as those, in Article 31, which stress the role of the State, public institutions and local authorities in mustering "all the means available to facilitate equal access of citizens to the conditions conducive to the exercise of their rights to (...) vocational training and physical and artistic education (...) employment and government support to find a job or secure self-employment (and to) access public office on the basis of merit" require that mechanisms be set up to ensure equal access, career promotion - especially in the public sector - as well as the application of the legislation on appointment in senior positions, keeping in mind the goal of achieving gender parity.

The development and application of mechanisms to strike a balance between family and working life and to facilitate women's access to the productive sectors and decision-making bodies is a key element that will promote equal opportunity between men and women on the job market.

In the private sector, protection must be sought through a system that enhances corporate social responsibility to monitor the implementation of the Labor Code in order to fight all forms of discrimination. Support should also be given to sectors where workers are mostly women, such as textiles and food processing, as well as to the promotion of income-generating activities, in addition to helping turn informal production units into businesses and supporting the initiatives of women entrepreneurs.

Conclusions and future prospects

The Government Plan for Equality towards the Achievement of Gender Parity provides a practical, single-template framework for the contributions and initiatives of the various government departments. The aim is to implement the principles of equality towards the achievement of gender parity, through the adoption of a participatory approach that takes into consideration the provisions of the new Constitution, the general and sectoral obligations contained in the Government's Program and the contents of the various sectoral strategies.

However, the success of this plan hinges on the commitment of all government departments in charge of direct implementation, as well as on private sector, civil society and international partners, particularly our main partner, the European Union; the aim is to rise to the challenge of equality and face the objective and subjective constraints with respect to achieving gender parity.
